Background and Special Features

The PGY1 Pharmacy Practice Residency at Arkansas Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS) College of Pharmacy is designed to provide the resident with broad-based learning experiences in a pediatric environment. Through participation in the teaching

certificate program and other teaching experiences, residents will further develop their communication skills and teaching abilities. Through participation in scholarly activities, residents will hone their problem-solving skills and ability to generate, interpret, and disseminate knowledge within their practice.

- General Pediatrics
- Research
- Academic/Precepting of students - may repeat PICU, NICU, or Antimicrobial Stewardship

Elective Rotations (Choose 2)

- Introduction to Antimicrobial Stewardship
- Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit
- Emergency Medicine
- Any core rotation can be repeated as electives

Longitudinal Experiences

- Hematology/Oncology Clinic
- Pharmacy Staffing
- Therapeutic Drug Monitoring/Call Service
- Postgraduate Research Certificate Program
- Teaching Certificate Program
- Book Club

Additional Responsibilities

- Residents complete a medication use evaluation
- Design and conduct a research project
- Provide staffing one weekend per month
- Provide clinical call coverage one weekend per month and a major holiday

- Teaching Certificate Program including Therapeutics Recitation, PBL Pediatrics Elective, and precept 2 months of pharmacy students

Application Process

Eligibility

Applicants must possess a degree in pharmacy from an American Council on Pharmaceutical Education (ACPE) accredited college. The applicant must also be eligible for licensure in the state of Arkansas and a member of ASHP.

The ACH / UAMS College of Pharmacy PGY1 program participates in the ASHP Match. Applicants must submit the following documents to PhORCAS:

- Letter of intent
- Curriculum vitae
- Three(3) letters of recommendation
- Official transcript from pharmacy school
